
# Indigenous inclusion strategy



# Business Façade Program Expansion 2024

#### **Background & Proof of Value**

- The pilot was completed in Scotch Creek in partnership the North Shuswap Chamber (NSC) of Commerce & ETSI-BC in 2023.
- \$18,000 made available to businesses for Façade improvements.
- 50/50 business match requirement.
- 5 applications were approved. All funds allocated.
- \$36,000 of Façade improvements by Scotch Creek businesses.

2024 plan - Expand throughout all SEDS areas.



# Shuswap Broadband Cooperative Ready, set,

#### **Project timeline & milestones**

- Project start June 2022
- Grant application submitted Mar. 2023 to Connected Communities BC (CCBC)
- Total project amount- \$30M Grant amount-\$27M Balance- BMO financing
- Signed MoU with Skw'lax te Secwepemculecw in 2023 (lead indigenous partner)
- Governance structure and founding documents in place
- Cooperatives First consulted on structure & governance
- Open access community-owned network
- 3 RFI (requests for information) received from CCBC
- Expected outcome 1st-2nd quarter 2024


### 2024 Shuswap Butcher Hub Network

#### **Background**

- A Pre-feasibility study was conducted in 2023 to assess the need to start an Abattoir in our area

#### **Key findings/ recommendations**

- support existing Abattoirs Keenan Family Farms & Yankee Flats Meats
- connect local meat producers with high-end markets to build Shuswap brand
- monitor government supports
- host a Butcher Hub Network presentation with BCSSMPA (BC Small Scale Meat Producers Assn.)





Pre-feasibility study for Shuswap Agrifoods Coop

#### Vision

- Unite and support the Shuswap agriculture supply chain and become the leading provider of Shuswap dairy, produce, and food products and services for all members.
- Increase the viability, sustainability and profitability of all members.
- Collaborate and assist in positioning the Shuswap Agrifoods experience, as a major drawing card & economic generator for the area.






#### Salmon River Valley Business Society
